SUPER SIMPLE STEPS:

1. Water down the Blue and Grey paint. Then use a fan brush to paint a washy coat all over the outside of the vase alternating between the two colors. Allow to dry before screening on the pattern using Black goo.
2. Paint in the female bird using one thick coat and working quickly while it's wet so it'll all blend together. We are starting with Cream on the belly, then add in Tan as you work out toward it's back. Then add Red on the tips of the wings.
3. Next, paint in the male bird using one thick coat and working quickly while it's wet so it'll all blend together. Start with Red on the belly and face, then Maroon toward his back and tips of feathers. Both birds get Orange beaks.
4. The branches get one heavy coat of Brown, and one heavy coat of White on the snow. The Pine cones and needles need watered down paint. We used just one heavy coat of Dark Brown on the pine cones and Green on the needles.
5. Splatter watered down White all over to give the effect of snow.
